

FROSTFIRE AWARD REQUIREMENTS

(The cold weather award for the hardiest of campers!)

The following is what must be accomplished during the same outing:

1. You must spend two (2) consecutive nights sleeping outdoors under the stars, in tents, in Adirondacks, or under tarps, in igloos or snow caves.
2. The overnight temperature must be no warmer than 32 F. It may be colder if you like. Always follow the Guide to Safe Scouting as a means to determine safety in cold weather conditions.
3. You may NOT use any artificial means of heating your shelter or sleeping arrangements.
4. You must cook at least two (2) meals in the out of doors.
5. You must accomplish two (2) of the following scout skills that you have not already achieved:
 - a. Cook ALL of your meals on an open fire or charcoal.
 - b. Complete the Camping Merit Badge requirement 5
 - c. Complete Requirement 4A and 4B of the Nature Merit Badge.
 - d. Complete Tenderfoot Requirements 1, 2, 3, and 5.
 - e. Complete Second Class Requirements 1a, 1b, 2b, 2g, and 5.
 - f. Complete First Class Requirements 1, 4a – 4e, and 7c.
 - g. Take part in one of the three snow sports: alpine skiing, snowboarding, or cross country skiing.
 - h. Complete requirement 1, 2a and 2b of the Skating merit badge for Ice Skating.
 - i. Complete requirements 5, 6, 8, and 9 of the Wilderness Survival merit badge.
 - j. Complete requirements 1 and 4 of the Astronomy merit badge.
6. Each Participant (Youth and Adult) must demonstrate his/her ability in completing the scout skills listed above while on this outing to receive the Frostfire Award.
7. The troop must attach a signed copy of its tour permit to the Frostfire application form.
8. Bring the COMPLETELY FILLED OUT application to the Northwest Suburban Scout Shop when it has been done. You may purchase patches for the participants at that time. Cost of the patch is \$2.00 per patch as of 2/1/05.
